The Viennese Coffee House Family

When Vienna was struggling through the time after World War II Coffee Houses became once again the focal point of social life in a city in shambles. These establishments did not only offer coffee and snacks to their tenants. In post-war Vienna they were among the few locales that where heated and lit! Thus it appears logical that coffee houses gained a lot of attention from the interior design trade attracting important designers and receiving elaborate fixtures. Lobmeyr was among the most sought-after suppliers for exquisite lighting. With the wide variety of fixtures of the cartwheel-type Lobmeyr could supply inexpensive yet magnificent lights to the cultural hot-spots. The "Langenzersdorf" fixture is one of the most classical and plain examples of this type. It can easily be adapted to any size and has a great potential for bespoke variants.
