Only when the formula for the porcelain mass, the glaze and the firing technique are optimally coordinated can the transparency of the porcelain and brilliance of the glaze typical of Nymphenburg be produced. Over 36 hours, this small, nine-centimetre-high Rococo bowl is also subjected to so-called glost firing at 1,400°C, during which the glaze melts into the porcelain. The result is the pure white, particularly smooth and hard surface for which Nymphenburg porcelain is famous.
