Whether glazed or unglazed – as early as the 18th century, porcelain spoons were an essential part of refined tableware. Together with the fashionable chinoiserie style, specimens such as this Rococo Spoon, decorated with intricate scrolls and tendrils, swiftly gained the favour of the avant-garde, which was well versed in matters of taste. Speaking of taste: thanks to their neutral material, porcelain spoons quickly became a popular utensil for eating caviar, boiled eggs and other sulphur-rich foods.
